

Like the inside of a spaceship, Frieda invites us to think about what little changes we can make on the inside that will change things in the outside world, too.

## About the Show

Frieda has created 5 new artworks for this show.

The big hinged canvases in the exhibition are inspired by altar paintings from the 15th century. They normally have different sections that are hinged, just like Frieda's, and show images of religious subjects.

Frieda has changed these traditional images to include things like cars and spaceships, inviting us to imagine the different possibilities for the future.



### Can you find?

In the gallery there is a big painting of a spaceship's control board. Frieda has painted this to scale, which means it is the right size for us to step into, take control, and fly away!



Frieda likes to paint the insides of spaceships and cars, including the control panel and buttons. Frieda is interested in how just pushing one little button in a car or spaceship can create a big impact. You could speed up, or change direction, while sitting completely still,
